

## Declaration of Non-Political Status

The **Belsize Society** values its non-political status and sees this as crucial to its credibility and charitable standing. This means we need to ensure that our trustees-and committee members are politically neutral and that we take a balanced approach in our contact with local councillors and political parties.

## HOW WE MAINTAIN OUR NON-POLITICAL STATUS

## Trustees' and committee members' involvement in any political or lobbying activities:

- No serving local councillors can be trustees or members of the Society's committee.
- If a trustee or committee member intends to stand for election to the local council, he/she will resign as trustee and/or from the committee.
- Prospective trustees and committee members will be asked to declare whether they are
  actively involved with a local political party or lobby group and agree that if they are elected
  as a trustee or to the Belsize Society committee, they will not seek to use their position to
  promote the policies of the party or lobby group to which they are affiliated.

## Contact with local councillors and political parties:

When the **BelSoc** trustees and committee meet with local councillors, singly or as a group, they will ensure that:

- The interests of all the wards covering the Belsize area are represented but recognise that some wards cover less of the area than others.
- All political parties that have councillors in the Belsize area have the opportunity to meet with us.
- We are sensitive to the range of demands on councillors' time.
- The Committee will not invite local councillors to contribute to BelSoc events and
  publications in a way that would provide a platform for a particular party to promote it's
  policies.
- Local councillors may be asked to contribute on local issues in a non-party political way.
