In 2020, around 20 environmental groups joined forces with an interest in the environment and quality of life in London, to agree a set of priorities for the next Mayor. The result was the '[A More Natural Capital](#)' manifesto, a shared agenda for building a greener city.

Ahead of the Mayoral and Assembly Elections on 6th May, The More Natural Capital coalition have now joined forces with other climate and transport groups across London to host the '[Mayoral Environment Debate](#)'

The online debate, chaired by presenter & environmentalist **Julia Bradbury**, will be the spotlight moment for the environment in the Mayoral campaign, allowing candidates to put forward their policies on nature and climate to London's voters. There is also the opportunity for members of the public to submit questions in advance.

Key issues to be debated include: air pollution, ensuring London has thriving parks and green spaces, helping wildlife and our climate recover, support for green jobs and the development of more sustainable local transport infrastructure.
